National IESNA Tampa Conference has New Ideas on Lighting.

The IESNA Annual Conference was held in Tampa at the end of July. Several notable sessions were given, and other important events occurred.

There was much discussion about the results of recent research regarding non-visual effects of lighting. There is strong research that shows that a third set of sensors in the retina, the Ganglion Cells contain Melanopsin that is known to affect circadian factors in mammals. This represents a serious breakthrough in establishing the non-visual ramifications of lighting.

Other important issues given much discussion were design elements and factors related to outdoor lighting. This relates to the recently completed Model Lighting Ordinance from the International Dark Sky's Association. While there is much agreement with the objectives of the MLO, its prescriptive method is not as results oriented or flexible as some participants would like to see. A special task force was formed to address this issue and open communication with the IDA. This promises to be a lively and hopefully, productive
